

Going to Scouts



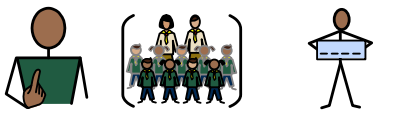
I am going to Scouts.

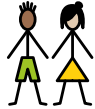
Leaders



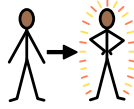
The leaders are called



They organise activities and help me and the other young people.

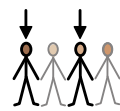
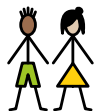


Young Leaders are older children and are there to help.

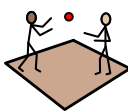


Young Leaders learn how to become a leader when they are older.

Scouts may wear a uniform.



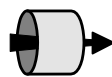
The uniform is a teal green shirt or blouse with navy blue trousers or skirt.

Rules

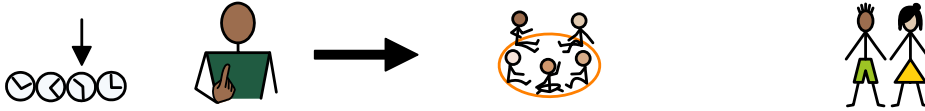


I will listen to the leader's instructions.

These small groups are called Patrols.



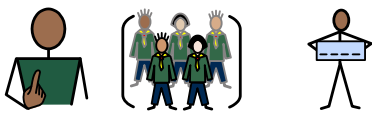
In a Patrol, one of the young people will be a Patrol Leader.

An Assistant Patrol Leader may be in the Patrol to help the Patrol Leader.

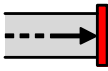

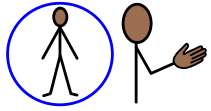
