

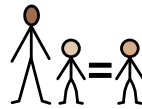
# Going to Cubs

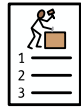

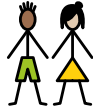
# Leaders



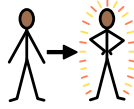
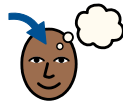
The leaders are called .....



They are there to organise activities and help me and the other children.

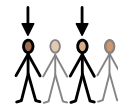


Young Leaders are older children and are there to help.

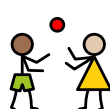


Young Leaders learn how to become a leader when they are older.

Cubs may wear a uniform.



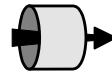
The uniform is a dark green jumper or polo shirt.

I can earn badges for my uniform.

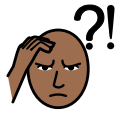
# Help

# Rules



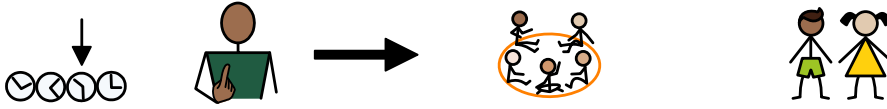
I will listen to the leader's instructions.

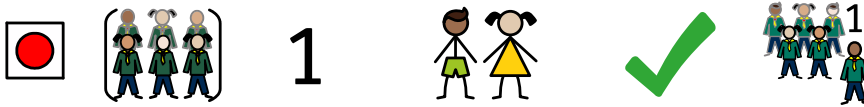
# Sixes



Sometimes, I will be in a small group with other children.



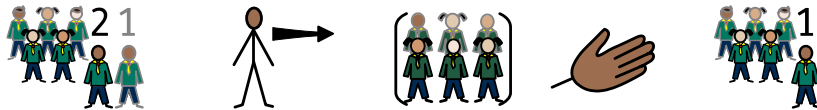
These small groups are called a Six.



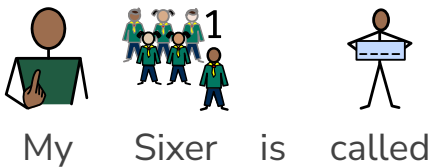
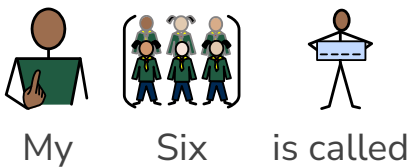
In a Six, one of the children will be a Sixer.

A Sixer may be in the Six to help the Sixer.



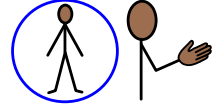
